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DISTRICT ONE DISTRICTWIDE ROADWATCH REPORT #44 FOR WEEK OF OCTOBER 29, 2017

District One is 12 counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Polk and Sarasota

Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.

As a reminder, travelers can visit www.FL511.com or dial "511" from their phone to learn about traffic conditions on major roadways across the state.

If you know before you go, you can plan accordingly and save time and money.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY

Kings Highway from the I-75 southbound off-ramp to Veterans Boulevard: Construction project: Crews begin work to build a dedicated turn lane from the southbound I-75 exit ramp to northbound Veterans Boulevard. This improvement will eliminate the need for motorists to merge with westbound Kings Highway traffic before turning right onto Veterans Boulevard.

- **Motorists should expect the outside lane of the I-75 southbound exit ramp to westbound Kings Highway to be closed during the nighttime/overnight hours from 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. Monday, October 30 through Saturday, November 4. Motorists headed westbound from the exit ramp must continue to the signal at Kings Highway before turning right.**
- **Motorists should expect lane closures on westbound Kings Highway during nighttime/overnight hours from 8:30 p.m. to 5 a.m.**

Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Expected completion is fall 2017. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida.

US 41 from Cross Street to Cochran Boulevard: Construction project: Crews improve 5.8 miles of US 41. The project includes signal upgrades at various intersections, milling and resurfacing, miscellaneous shoulder widening, bike lanes and improved pedestrian access at multiple intersections. **Motorists should expect multiple lane closures on US 41 throughout the limits of the project during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 pm to 6 am, Sunday through Friday, weather permitting as paving of mainline and crossovers are in progress.** Motorists should be aware of heavy machinery and large trucks entering and exiting the roadway while paving operations are ongoing and use caution. They should remain alert and follow directions provided by traffic control officers and devices while driving in this area. **Temporary restricted access to side streets may also occur.** Project completion is expected fall 2017. The Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

US 41 from Enterprise Drive to the Sarasota/Charlotte County Line: Construction project: Crews are working to expand US 41 to six lanes from Enterprise Drive to the Sarasota/Charlotte County line. This 3.6-mile project also includes making roadway drainage improvements, installing water and sewer lines, adding bike lanes and sidewalk and replacing signals at Enterprise Drive, Toledo Blade Boulevard and S. Cranberry/Cornelius Boulevards. Crews are installing new utilities, building new roadway and drainage. Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the project.

- **Chamberlain Boulevard median is closed.**
- **Collingswood Boulevard median on US 41 is closed.**
- **The northbound and southbound left turn lanes at Dahlgren Avenue will be closed for a month.**
- **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours on Toledo Blade Boulevard.**
- **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours on US 41 from Paulson Drive to Salford Boulevard.**
- **The speed limit is reduced to 40 miles per hour.**

Motorists should be aware of construction vehicles and equipment entering and exiting the roadway. The contractor expects to complete work in fall 2017. The contractor is Guymann Construction Inc.

SR 31 at Bermont Road: Construction project: Crews replace flashing beacons and signal poles at the intersection. Crews are completing punch list items and site clean-up. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during the daytime and nighttime hours. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Expected completion is fall 2017. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida.

COLLIER COUNTY

I-75/Alligator Alley Rest Area (mile marker 63): Construction project: Work is underway to build a new rest area and water treatment plant on the north side of the roadway. Estimated project completion is spring 2018. The contractor is West Construction, Inc.

I-75 from Broward County Line (mile marker 50) to east of CR 951/Collier Boulevard (mile marker 101): Construction project: This safety project adds approximately 78 miles (39 miles in each direction) of guardrail along I-75/Alligator Alley. Crews will begin a moving pavement operation at CR 951 (exit #101) and work easterly to the Broward County line. Crews will then work from the Broward County line westerly to just east of CR 951. Guardrail installation will follow behind the pavement operation. Crews will work 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays. Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway.

- **Motorists should expect intermittent northbound lane shifts from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, while crews install guardrail, weather permitting.**

Motorists should use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated completion is summer 2017. The contractor is the de Moya Group, Inc.

US 41 from Pine Ridge Road to Sandpine Drive: Construction project: Crews will be placing sidewalk, drainage structures and lighting on the east side of US 41. Crews will also resurface the intersection of US 41 and Pelican Bay Boulevard. Work occurs during daytime and nighttime hours. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures through the duration of the project during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.** Drivers should use caution traveling in this area. Estimated completion is summer 2018. The American Lighting & Signalization, Inc.

SR 84/Davis Boulevard from County Barn Road to Unity Way: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent westbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, while crews repair a left turn lane. Motorists should use caution as crews work in the roadway.

Pinecrest Elementary School Sidewalks from West Delaware Avenue to Colorado Avenue: Construction project: This project will install sidewalk and drainage structures at various locations on South 7th Street, South 4th Street, South 3rd Street and South 2nd Street. **Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime hours from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through the duration of the project, weather permitting.** Motorists

and pedestrians should use caution traveling in the work zone. Estimated project completion is spring 2018. The Contractor is L-J Construction Company.

2nd Street South from 6th Avenue South to 11th Avenue South: Construction project: This project will construct sidewalk on the east side of the roadway. **Motorists should expect lane closures during daytime hours from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, weather permitting.** Motorists should use caution while driving in this area. Estimated completion is spring 2018. The contractor is V & H Construction, Inc.

3rd Street North from Central Avenue to 7th Avenue North: Construction project: This project will construct sidewalk on the west side of the roadway. **Motorists should expect lane closures during daytime hours from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, weather permitting.** Motorists should use caution while driving in this area. Estimated completion is spring 2018. The contractor is V & H Construction, Inc.

DESOTO COUNTY

US 17 from CR 760A to Heard Street and within the City of Arcadia: Construction project: Crews are expanding US 17 to four lanes. The new roadway is nearly complete and open with two lanes of traffic northbound and southbound. Expect daytime, intermittent single lane closures on US 17 for various project completion activities. Motorists should continue to observe the posted speed limits. Please use caution and plan additional travel time. Expected project completion is in the fall of 2017. The contractor is Prince Contracting.

US 17 from Livingston Street to Hardee / Desoto County Line: Construction project: Crews will be milling and resurfacing the roadway and improving drainage to approximately 6.7 miles of roadway. The contractor will also install curb and gutters, guardrails and sidewalks.

- **Motorists should expect single lanes of both the northbound and southbound lanes of US 17 to be closed Monday through Saturday from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. to include: milling and paving of crossovers and widening areas, and also storm recovery work from October 30, 2017 through November 3, 2017.**

Watch for crews and equipment working close to the road. Please observe posted speed limits and drive with caution in the construction zone. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida. Estimated completion is spring 2018.

GLADES COUNTY

Moore Haven Elementary Sidewalks: Construction project: Crews will install sidewalks to the north side of Avenue J from 5th Street to 1st Street and the south side of Avenue K from 6th Street to 1st Street.

- **Crews are installing striping for sidewalks to the north side of Avenue J from 5th Street to 1st Street and to the south side of avenue K from 6th Street to 1st Street.**

During construction we ask motorists and pedestrians to use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway. Motorists should expect periodic lane closures as part of the construction process. Estimated project completion is end of year 2017. The contractor is Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc.

US 27 from Old 27 to 5th Street: Construction Project: The northbound and southbound access lanes to the bridge on US 27 from Old 27 to 5th Street in Moore Haven will be repaved and the outside shoulders of the road will be widened. Additional improvements include installing drainage, curb and gutter, guardrails, signing and pavement markings.

- **Motorists should expect intermittent road closures along northbound and southbound lanes of US 27 from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Saturday as crews are performing structural paving.**
- **Crews are continuing work installing drainage pipes underneath the bridge.**
- **Crews have resumed construction of new sidewalks and ADA improvements along US 27 at the west area of the bridge.**

During construction we ask motorists and pedestrians to use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway. Estimated project completion is end of year 2017. The contractor is Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc.

US 27 at South Central Florida Express (SCFE) Railroad Crossing: Construction project: Crews install guardrail, crash cushions, and new flashing beacons at the railroad crossing. Work also includes moving the existing stop bar for southbound lanes to the north to aid with sight distance to gate lights. Motorists should expect daytime lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Flaggers will be onsite to assist drivers. Drivers should use caution while traveling in this area. Expected completion is early 2018, weather permitting. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida.

US 27 from the Glades County Line to the Palm Beach County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

US 27 from the Highlands County Line to the Hendry County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 80 from the Lee County Line to US 27: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 79 from Lake Port to Indian Prairie Canal: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 78 from US 27 to the Okeechobee County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 78 from SR 29 to US 27: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

US 27 from SR 78 in Ortona to SR 78 in Lakeport: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 29 from the Hendry County Line to US 27: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 29 from the Collier County Line to the Glades County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

State Roadways (SR 78, SR 29 and SR 27): Maintenance contract project: Crews will be removing Hurricane Irma debris on state roadways. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution and expect delays.

HARDEE COUNTY

US 17 from Livingston Street to Hardee / Desoto County Line: Construction project: Crews will be milling and resurfacing the roadway and improving drainage to approximately 6.7 miles of roadway. The contractor will also install curb and gutters, guardrails and sidewalks.

- **Motorists should expect single lanes of both the northbound and southbound lanes of US 17 to be closed Monday through Saturday from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. to include: milling and paving of crossovers and widening areas, and also storm recovery work from October 30, 2017 through November 3, 2017.**

Watch for crews and equipment working close to the road. Please observe posted speed limits and drive with caution in the construction zone. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida. Estimated completion is spring 2018.

US 17 from the Hardee/Desoto County Line to Sweetwater Road (CR 634): Construction Project: Following recovery from storm impacts, crews will be resuming work widening US 17 from two lanes to four lanes, adding a grassed median and building new two-lane bridges over Charlie Creek and Charlie Creek Overflow. The contractor will also install new roadside drainage swales and storm water ponds to manage water running off the roadway. The contractor is Watson Civil Construction. Watch for crews and equipment working close to the road. Drivers should expect daytime lane closures and flaggers will direct motorists through the work zone in a single lane. Please observe posted speed limits and drive with caution in the construction zone. Estimated completion is summer 2018.

US 17 from south of West 9th Street to north of West 3rd Street: Construction Project: Crews are constructing a new four-lane concrete roadway using the old railroad corridor along Oak Street to realign this 1-mile segment. The contractor is installing curb and gutter, 7-foot bike lanes, sidewalks, and a 52-foot raised median to separate the northbound and southbound lanes of traffic. The project also includes installing a new underground drainage system and two storm water ponds to manage water running off of the roadway.

- **Motorists should follow the new traffic pattern on eastbound and westbound SR 66 and northbound and southbound US 17. Watch for signs and use the posted detour route utilizing the new SR 66 detour to travel around the work zone.**
- **Motorists should expect periodic lane closures on US 17 in both directions for construction operations as crews work from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday.**
- **Oak Street, 3rd Street East, 4th Street East, 5th Street East and 7th Street East are closed.**

Motorists should be aware that a new traffic pattern has been implemented at the southern end of the project. Please pay attention to new signage and pavement markings directing traffic through the work zone.

Estimated completion is fall 2018. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida.

HENDRY COUNTY

US 27 from SR 80 to the Palm Beach County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be landscaping near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 82 from the Collier County Line to the Lee County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be repairing signs near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near and on the roadway.

SR 80 from the Lee County line to Double J. Acres: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be constructing a median opening and right turn lane. Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution and expect delays.

SR 80 from Dalton Lane to CR 833: Construction project: Crews will widen approximately 11 miles of roadway from two to four lanes and add new turning lanes. Additional work includes repaving the current lanes of SR 80 and constructing ten new bridges. Three of the bridges will require full demolition and removal of the existing bridges in order to construct the new ones. Work also includes drainage improvements, adding curb and gutter, and installing LED lighting. Estimated project completion is summer 2020. The contractor is AJAX Paving Industries of Florida.

SR 80 from Double J. Acres Road to CR 78A: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. while crews construct turn lanes, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80 from Dalton Lane to Indian Hills Drive: Maintenance permit project: Crews will be relocating utilities near the roadway during daytime hours, Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

State Roadways (SR 80, SR 29 and SR 27): Maintenance contract project: Crews will be removing Hurricane Irma debris on state roadways. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution and expect delays.

HIGHLANDS COUNTY

US 27 From Tomoka Blvd. to S. Lakeview Road: Construction Project: Crews will be removing concrete and installing ditch blocks and other drainage modifications along this one-mile segment of US 27. As part of this project, crews will install guardrail, add paved shoulders and sod, make drainage improvements and relocate highway lighting. No lane closures are expected. Watch for crews working in the roadway. Estimated

project completion is End of Year 2017. The contractor is C-squared Certified General Contractor.

US 27 North and Southbound at Shop 16 in Avon Park: Permit Project: Crews will be installing traffic signals and cross walks. Watch for lane closures in this area. Also the median opening at the Murphy Gas Station will be modified to a directional left turn only. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

US 27 Southbound at Lake Josephine Drive: Permit Project: Crews will resurface the roadway/connection at the intersection of Lake Josephine Drive and SR 25 (US 27). Watch for trucks entering and exiting the site. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

US 27 Southbound between Golfview Rd. and Tubbs Rd: Permit Project: Crews will reconstruct the driveway/connection at the old Mexican Restaurant location and adjacent property. Watch for trucks entering and exiting the site. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

US 27 Southbound at the intersection of Lakewood Drive: Permit Project: Crews will reconstruct the driveway/connection at the old Wendy's/new Popeye's location and adjacent property. Watch for trucks entering and exiting the site. Please use caution in this area and watch for crews working close to the roadway.

SR 66 from Highlands/Hardee County line to west of US 27/US 98: Construction Project: Crews are repaving approximately 9 miles of roadway on both the northbound and southbound lanes of SR 66 from the Highlands/Hardee County Line to US 27. Additional improvements include the addition of a right turn lane on to Skipper Road, widening the right turn lanes on to South George Boulevard, Sparta Road, and Woodland Creek Trail, installing drainage, curb and gutter, guardrail, pavement markings, and signage. Anticipate daytime lane closures on SR 66 during construction and expect delays.

- **Motorists should expect single lane closures and be prepared to follow flagger direction.**

Please use caution in this area and be aware of crews working close to the roadway. Estimated project completion is summer 2018. The contractor is Lawrence Lynch Corporation.

Rucks Dairy Road Bridge: Construction Project: Crews will build a new two lane bridge to replace the current one lane bridge. Construction of the new bridge will be next to the current bridge. Additional improvements will include resurfacing a portion of the road approaching the new bridge, drainage enhancements, new guardrails and updated signage.

- **Motorists should expect a traffic signalization system to be in place directing traffic through the work zone. Expect delays and watch for crews working in the roadway.**

The Contractor is Leware Construction Company of Florida. Motorists should use caution when traveling through the work zone. Expected project completion is spring 2018.

LEE COUNTY

US 41 from Playa Del Sol Boulevard to Business 41: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent northbound and southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday while crews construct turn lanes, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 41 from Marsh Landing Boulevard to Fountain Lakes Boulevard: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent northbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday while crews construct turn lanes, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

US 41 from just south of Pelican Colony Boulevard to San Carlos Boulevard: Construction project: This project installs light poles on both sides of the roadway. Work occurs during daytime and nighttime hours. **Motorists should expect intermittent outside lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the project, weather permitting. Pedestrians should expect intermittent northbound and southbound sidewalk closures. Pedestrians should use caution and follow detour signs.** Motorists and pedestrians should use caution traveling in the work zone. Estimated project completion is spring 2018. The contractor is Valiant Power South.

US 41 from San Souci Drive to Tara Boulevard: Construction project: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures as crews install sidewalk and drainage improvements along the east and west side of US 41. The majority of the work will be done during daytime hours. Lane closures may occur during daytime and nighttime hours, Monday through Saturday. **Local area residents will have access at all times.** Motorists and pedestrians should follow detour signs and use caution while traveling in this area. Estimated project completion is fall 2017. The contractor is Preferred Materials, Inc.

US 41 from North Bay Street to Jonathans Bay Drive: Maintenance contract project: Crews will replace sidewalk during daytime hours from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 884/Colonial Boulevard at the Walmart Driveway: Construction project: Crews work to remove the remaining portion of the plaza's exit lane to Colonial Boulevard. Crews will also extend the eastbound to southbound right-turn lane on Colonial Boulevard to Six Mile Cypress/Ben C. Pratt Parkway. Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. on eastbound Colonial Boulevard (including plaza entrance). Drivers and pedestrians should use caution while crews work in and near the roadway. Expected completion is fall 2017. The contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida.

SR 867/McGregor Boulevard from Colonial Boulevard to College Parkway: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect northbound and southbound lane closures as crews landscape near the roadway during daytime hours, between 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, weather permitting. Flaggers will direct motorists through the work zone during lane closures. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 865/San Carlos Boulevard at Isle of Palms Drive: Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect outside southbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. as crews repair a billboard damaged by Hurricane Irma. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 82 from Lee Boulevard/Colonial Boulevard to Shawnee Road: Construction project: Crews will be widening SR 82 to six lanes from east of Lee Boulevard to Shawnee Road. **Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures on SR 82 throughout the duration of the project during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 pm to 6 am, Monday through Friday, weather permitting.** Additional work includes construction of a median separating three 12-foot travel lanes in each direction, 6.5-foot inside paved shoulders, bike lanes, a 5-foot sidewalk on the north side and a 10-foot shared-use path on the south side. The project will also add a grass median and LED lighting throughout this segment. The project also includes constructing Florida's first Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI) at the intersection of SR 82 at Daniels Parkway/Gunnery Road. The CFI will ease traffic congestion at the intersection and include multiple signals to reduce turning delays. The expected completion date is end of summer of 2019. The Contractor is Ajax Paving Industries of Florida, LLC.

SR 80/First Street from US 41 to Monroe Street: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect southbound and northbound traffic delays as crews conduct a slow-moving operation to stripe the roadway during nighttime/overnight hours, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80/Palm Beach Boulevard from Freemont Street to Lexington Avenue: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from Monday through Friday as crews conduct storm drain maintenance, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80/Palm Beach Boulevard from Fowler Street to the Hendry County Line: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect southbound and northbound traffic delays as crews conduct a slow-moving operation to stripe the roadway during nighttime hours, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 80/Seaboard Street from Second Street to SR 80/Palm Beach Boulevard: Maintenance contract project: Motorists should expect southbound and northbound traffic delays as crews conduct a slow-moving operation to stripe the roadway during nighttime hours, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

SR 78/Pine Island Road from Santa Barbara Boulevard to Hibiscus Drive: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be installing sod along the roadway during daytime hours, weather permitting. Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

Construction project: Motorists can expect intermittent lane closures throughout the project while crews continue project completion items including paving, repair work, storm drainage testing, signage, signal work, miscellaneous concrete and punch list items.

Please stay alert and exercise caution throughout the project. Pay close attention to the traffic control devices. Driving through the traffic control devices and into the work zone is prohibited. Be aware of slow moving construction equipment and plan additional travel time throughout the project.

The project consists of significant drainage improvements, removing old asphalt and resurfacing the roadway, reconstructing sidewalk, and installing new signalization in some areas. The project also includes construction of eleven (11) pedestrian refuge islands on Bee Ridge Road between Dunn Drive and US 41. Expected completion of the \$17 million project is late fall 2017.
