# STAY AT THE SCENE

## HIT-AND-RUN PENALTIES

Leaving the scene of the crash with:

### Property Damage

- Second degree misdemeanor
- Up to 60 days in prison and \$500 fine

### Injuries

- Second or third degree felony
- Revoked license for at least 3 years
- Up to 5 years in prison and \$5,000 fine

### Fatalities

- First degree felony
- Revoked license for at least 3 years
- Mandatory minimum of 4 years in prison, up to 30 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine

The penalties for hit-and-run drivers changed on July 1, 2014 when the Aaron Cohen Life Protection Act was signed into Florida law (FLA. STAT. § 316.027).
