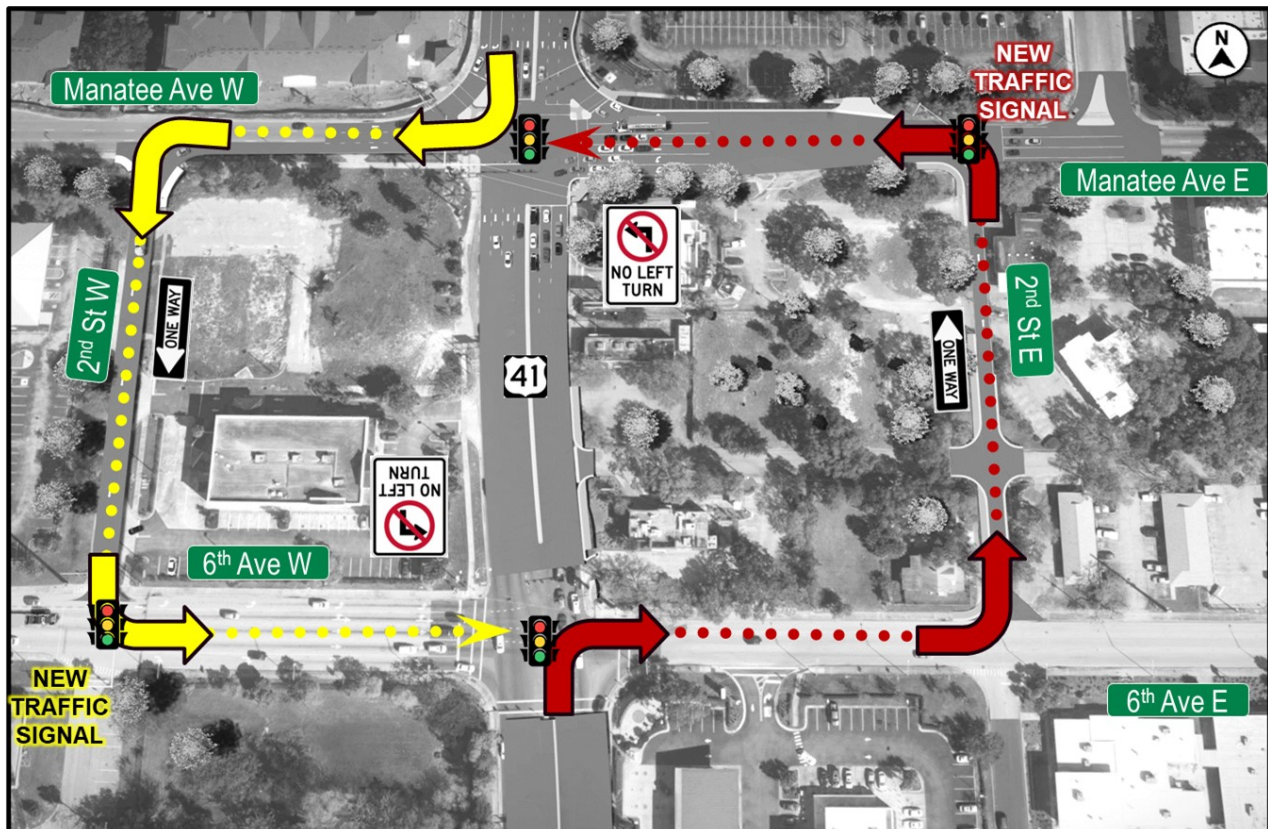


## PROJECT OVERVIEW

As part of the previously completed Central Manatee Network Alternatives Analysis (CMNAA), several short term improvements were recommended to reduce congestion and enhance safety within the 13-square mile study area of Bradenton and Palmetto.

To improve downtown circulation, increase safety and enhance operations, the northbound left-turn movement at Manatee Avenue and the southbound left-turn movement at 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue will be prohibited. This improvement will result in northbound left-turning drivers being rerouted to turn right onto 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue E, turn left onto 2<sup>nd</sup> Street E and turn left onto Manatee Avenue W. Southbound left-turning drivers will be rerouted to turn right onto Manatee Avenue W, turn left onto 2<sup>nd</sup> Street W and turn left onto 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue W. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street W and 2<sup>nd</sup> Street E will be converted to one-way roadways between 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Manatee Avenue. The southbound left turn lane at the intersection of US 41 and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Avenue will be extended and provide three through lanes in each direction on US 41 to extend through 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Manatee Avenue.

The design of this project is in progress and anticipated to be completed in early 2025. Construction is funded for fiscal year 2024, with an estimated cost of \$5.2 million.

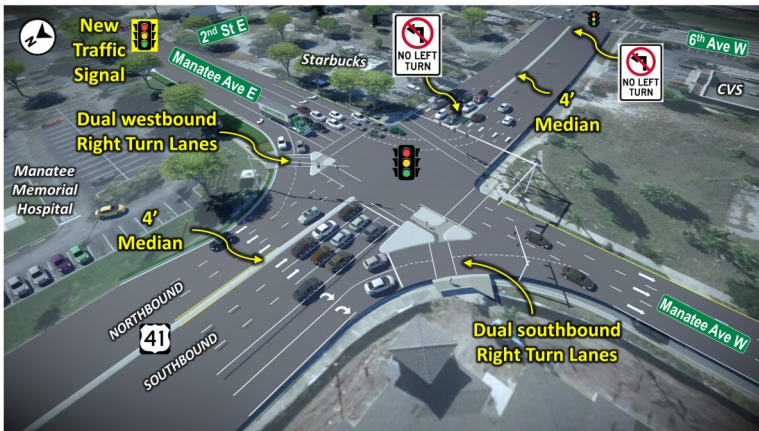

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## PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS



### US 41 at Manatee Avenue

- Northbound left-turn prohibited
- Dual southbound right turn lanes added
- Dual westbound right-turn lanes added

### 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue W at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street W

- One-way southbound on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street W
- New traffic signal installed at the intersection



### Manatee Avenue E at 2<sup>nd</sup> Street E

- One-way northbound on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street E
- New traffic signal installed at the intersection
